What are the accreditation requirements?	Programs approved for Early Start CT are given a 3-year window to achieve either NAEYC Accreditation, NAFCC Accreditation, or Head Start Approval. This requirement applies to all types of programs; center-based, group homes, family child care homes, and license-exempt.	
Our center is working towards NAEYC accreditation, are we still eligible to apply even though we are not yet accredited?	Yes, all programs state-wide may apply.	
Do school district programs and/or license exempt programs need to meet all requirements (example: accreditation and teacher requirements)?
